




I. (U) <u>PURPOSE</u>. This directive:



d. (S//(S/P))

- c. (U) Implements Intelligence Community Directive 304 (Reference (f)) guidance on the coordination and deconfliction of operations and activities that involve the use of clandestine methods.
- 2. (U) <u>APPLICABILITY</u>. This directive applies to OSD, the Military Departments, the Office of the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff (CJCS) and the Joint Staff, the Combatant Commands, the Office of the Inspector General of the Department of Defense, the Defense Agencies, the DoD Field Activities, and all other organizational entities within the Department of Defense (referred to collectively in this directive as the "DoD Components").
- 3. (U) POLICY. It is DoD policy that:

- i. (U) To the extent that any of the provisions of this directive conflict with any of the provisions of Reference (g), the provisions of this directive take precedence.
- 4. (U) RESPONSIBILITIES. See Enclosure 2.
- 5. (U) <u>SYNCHRONIZING AND COORDINATING CLANDESTINE HUMINT</u>
 <u>OPERATIONS</u>. See Enclosure 3.
- 6. (U) <u>RELEASABILITY</u>. Restricted. This directive is approved for restricted release. Authorized users may obtain copies on the SECRET Internet Protocol Router Network from the DoD Issuances Website at http://www.dtic.smil.mil/whs/directives.
- 7. (U) EFFECTIVE DATE. This directive:
 - a. (U) Is effective January 9, 2013.
- b. (U) Must be reissued, cancelled, or certified current within 5 years of its publication in accordance with DoDI 5025.0I (Reference (p)). If not, it will expire effective January 9, 2023 and be removed from the DoD Issuances Website.





- a. (U) Oversees the DCS in accordance with Reference (g) and DoDD 5143.01 (Reference (q)).




d. (U) Advocates for DoD and national programmatic resources to satisfy national-level intelligence requirements in accordance with Reference (q) and DoDD 7045.14 (Reference (r)).



- i. (U) On behalf of the Secretary and Deputy Secretary of Delense, approves exceptions to this directive, except as otherwise prohibited by law or Executive order.

b. (U) Identifies resource needs of the DCS through both DoD and national processes for planning, programming, budgeting, execution, and staffing in accordance with Reference (r).





GLOSSARY

(b)(1),1.4(c)

- (U) coordination. The process of sharing operational information and deconflicting activities prior to undertaking a proposed action. Coordination does not require approval or disapproval of the proposed action. See References (f), (m), and (n) for more information.
- (U) <u>counterintelligence</u>. Information gathered and activities conducted to identify, deceive, exploit, disrupt, or protect against espionage, other intelligence activities, sabotage, or assassinations conducted for or on behalf of foreign powers, organizations, or persons, or their agents, or international terrorist organizations or activities.
- (U) cover. A protective guise used by a person, organization, or installation to conceal true affiliation with clandestine or other sensitive activities.


- (U) <u>DHE</u>. The collective of DoD organizations authorized to conduct HUMINT and related intelligence activities under the centralized management of the DHM.
- (U) <u>Defense HUMINT Executor</u>. The senior DoD intelligence officials as designated by the heads of each of the DoD Components who are authorized to conduct HUMINT and related intelligence activities.

- (U) <u>HUMINT operations</u>. Intelligence activities, including military source operations, the primary purpose of which is to obtain foreign intelligence information collected and provided by human sources.
- (U) <u>intelligence requirement</u>. A requirement for intelligence to fill a gap in the command's knowledge or understanding of the operational environment or threat forces.



GLOSSARY

(U) military source operations. DoD HUMINT collection and operations focused on foreign military and military-related intelligence conducted under the authorities of the Secretary of Defense. Military source operations are conducted by appropriately trained and certified personnel under the control of a Defense HUMINT Executor.

- (U) special operations activities. Activities that include each of the following insofar as it relates to special operations: direct action, strategic reconnaissance, unconventional warfare, foreign internal defense, civil affairs, psychological operations, counterterrorism, humanitarian assistance, theater search and rescue, and such other activities as may be specified by the President or the Secretary of Defense.
- (U) source. A person, thing, or activity from which information or services are obtained.
